
# THE MODEL RAILROAD CLUB

# A SPANNER IN THE WORKS

**By Rob Seel.** Norfolk Southern crews have begun the work to align a new, temporary track through Clemson so that the long-awaited bridge project can start. The new bridge will replace the existing, fourspan, ballasted deck bridge, dating back to the mid-1970s. The new bridge will allow for five traffic lanes beneath and two tracks above, one of which being dedicated to highspeed trains!


