


THE 2011 TRAIN SHOW IS A WRAP!

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Regular Meeting at the Central Railway Museum

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Reece. Twenty-eight members were in attendance.

We had one guest, Anne Sheriff (of the Central Historical Society) who was introduced to the club.

In the absence of the Treasurer, Jim Reece reported that the state of the Treasury is good.

OLD BUSINESS:

There have been no material invoices to the city in January. We need any invoices for January turned in if any are due. To date we have been reimbursed \$14,176.12

President Jim has talked to the Mayor of Central about our receiving in-kind recognition for work making the bathroom handicap assessable. He has written a letter requesting the same to the City Council. Town Administrator Philip Mishoe e-mailed that he sees no problem with this and will talk with the Mayor. Kevin Campbell has been asked to head up this project.

The possibility of our hosting the fall 2011 meeting of the Palmetto Division of the NMRA was discussed. Ed Welch is to check out the use of Founders Hall at Southern Wesleyan University.

It appears we will be getting a \$500 grant from Wal-Mart, according to Ginny Marhanka, but we have no further information.

The President reminded everyone that it was time to get their dues in and for committee heads to start planning their budgets for 2011.

President Jim Reece asked everyone to help in getting the building cleaned up and for everyone to please take home anything there that is no longer being used.

CENTRAL 502 TO BEGIN SERVICE

Central, SC -- February 10, 1958 After a long wait the Central Railway's newly acquired RS2, No. 502 has finally arrived on the property. The 1500 hp road switcher was built by the American Locomotive Company's (ALCO) Kato Division and was painted for the Central at RMSArchitecture Model Shops. The unit is currently being upfitted for service at McInnis Electronics and is expected to enter road service in the near future. 






PATENTLY SPEAKING, of course

Again, **Bruce Gathman** sent in for us another fascinating example of the thousands of patent drawings we can see online through various websites. Bruce is a renown authority on geared locomotives, and not just designs by E. Shay. Here, Bruce sends us one of this chain-driven locomotive designed by William L. Sykes, of the Emporium Lumber Company of Conifer, NY.







I was in my hometown of Kingstree, S.C. last week taking photos around town. They are renovating the old depot, which dates back to the turn of the 20th Century, to house the Chamber of Commerce and possibly another restaurant. Anyway, the station still has a functioning waiting area, since Amtrak makes four stops daily -- remarkable for a town population of about 3,500. The Silver Meteor, which runs from Boston to Miami. makes two stops and the Palmetto, which runs from Boston to Savannah, makes two stops. The station served the Atlantic Coast Line and Seaboard Coast Line railroads during the 20th Century, Seaboard until about 1970 or '71. There was no passenger service until the Palmetto began stopping there in 1976. When we lived there in the 1990s, my son took the short train trip from Kingstree up to Florence with his preschool group. Amtrak's made stops there consistently since then. Now, many towns that size have had train depots torn down or fallen down and are just a memory -- yet this one still serves up passengers on their way up and down the Eastern Seaboard!
