<u>Trackwork</u>: Bob Folsom said track is to be laid on the completed road bed.


NEW BUSINESS:


It was announced the National Narrow Gauge Convention is to be held in Hickory NC Sept 7th -10th, 2011.

He believes the unit was being returned to the Chattahoochee Locomotive Company for some repair work. The unit is apparently a remanufactured ALCO S4 employed by the Sweet Bran company in Dalhart, Texas. The loco's number and reporting marks are stenciled on the frame, below the Sweet Bran logo at the cab end. The 2112's origins are currently unknown.
