October 6, 2011

Regular Meeting at the Central Railway Museum

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Reece. Twenty-three members were in attendance.

There were two guests present, Jerry Jordan and his grandson, Will.

The Treasurer reported that all bills were paid to date. He further elaborated on the importance of the of the Train Show to our finances for the following year.

OLD BUSINESS:

There have been no material invoices to the Town of Central in August. We need any invoices for September.

In Al Costa's absence, there was no report on the "Coats for Tots" program.

President Reece has been in touch with the City of Easley and reported they are working on the Train Show contract for 2012.

Joe Fitzpatrick reported the Boy Scout merit badge program for railroads has been made a council- wide program. He will follow up to see what we need to do.

Pickens County Accommodations Grant: The grant of \$2,500 has been received. This money will be applied to the Train Show, as it is a tourism-generating event.

Al Costa and Dan Marett are taking information for anyone wanting a club T-shirt.

These will e ordered in early December so get your information in as soon as possible.

Bob White has graciously offered a donation to help purchase fascia and curtains for the layout.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Train Show: Howard reported that the mailings have gone out and we have already received some table reservations back.

Museum Building: Nothing new to report

Central Railroad Festival: The city committee is starting to meet.

HO Layout:

Wiring: Howard Garner reported 99% of the lowered level lighting is in. He is adding signs for switches.

Scenery: Scenery is moving along well. A lot of work has been done that is beginning to show progress. Joe Fitzpatrick has about finished the Asheville yard area. We need to keep working on trees. We will need a great many.

Rolling Stock: No report.

<u>Trackwork</u>: Bob Folsom said he is still building turnouts and we are replacing some track and putting in a new spur near the paper mill.


~ Meanwhile, in Pickens ~

Just arrived: GP-40 and two slug units from CSX. The mother unit will be converted to remote control. The cab is to be narrowed, with a walkway on each side. The step wells are to be enlarged to allow an operator to safely stand in them and operate the locomotive. No word on just what is to be done with the slugs.


Be it known that I, ANDREW JACKSON BEARD, a citizen of the United States, residing at Eastlake, in the county of Jefferson and State of Alabama, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Car-Couplings; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same. My invention relates to improvements in that class of car-couplings in which horizontal jaws engage each other to connect the cars; and the objects of my improvement are, first, to provide a car-coupler of a simple and cheap form of construction, the coupler assembled in parts adapted to replace any of the pieces as desired; second, to provide a car-coupler having the head and shank constructed in separate parts and pivotally connected by a pin, by which a new head or shank can readily be attached to replace a broken part; third, to provide an automatic car-coupling having a head and side jaw pivotally attached to the shank, the head and jaw adapted to open and close in opposite directions to couple or uncouple the cars. I attain these objects by the mechanism illustrated in

the accompanying drawings, in which—Figure 1 is a top or plan view of my-improved automatic carcoupler. Fig. 2 is a vertical sectional view of the same through the center. Fig. 3 is a detail vertical side view of the head. Fig. 4 is a detail plan view of the side jaw. Fig. 5 is a front view of the same.

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THE PENN-JERSEY FLYER RESON FROM NEW YORK TO PHILLY RESON


